MINUTES

The Committee voted unanimously to approve the minutes of its November 17, 2005, meeting in San Diego, California.

FUTURE SITES

Ms. Nolan reported that she had secured locations and tentative destinations for the next several NCOIL meetings, through the 2007 Summer Meeting and also including the 2008 Annual, 2009 Summer, and 2009 Annual Meetings. She said that future sites were as follows:

The Committee discussed future locations for NCOIL conferences, including the appropriate season for a meeting in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Legislators authorized the Executive Director to do the following: 1) pursue either a Summer or Annual conference in Philadelphia, 2) investigate holding an NCOIL meeting in Washington, DC, and 3) look into other locations, including Corpus Christi, Texas.

The Committee discussed holding conferences in non-member states. Upon a motion made and seconded, legislators voted that, as a policy, NCOIL should give preference to locations in member states but also should pursue non-member sites in certain circumstances, including to attract NCOIL membership.

DUES AND MEMBERSHIP

Ms. Nolan said dues collection was going well, but she noted that dues from some states surprisingly had not been forthcoming. She and the Committee discussed various dues and membership-related issues. Among other things, they addressed the impact of term limits and financial modernization and federal preemption efforts on legislative participation. Committee members determined to contact lawmakers from non-member states regarding NCOIL.

The Committee also discussed items regarding the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC), NCOIL, individual state legislators and regulators, and related budget matters.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
